Payment/Pricing Options:

The cost for the entire 10-day course is \$500.00 per person, which includes all course materials. The rate for a single day is \$60.00. Students are encouraged to take the entire course, but may take any number of the 1 and 2 day modules. The beginning and ending weekend courses must be taken in their entirety. Each day will be a complete and effective experience for those wishing to learn part of the curriculum or brush up on a section that they missed. You will need to take all the preceding days in order to attend the design days. Students retaking courses pay half price.
